ADAPTECONII RESEARCH FOCUS

Tim's doctoral research focuses on understanding how an economy could function without growth. He uses systems dynamics and other prospective techniques to build macroeconomic models that explore postgrowth futures. His research aims at providing different scenarios to guide the transition to more sustainable and desirable economies. Those scenarios allow to test various combinations of macroeconomic policies such as worktime reduction, basic income, or complementary currency and sovereign money as to determine the most effective ways to transition towards an economic system that is more adapted to the social ecological reality of the 21st century.

Tim holds a bachelor degree in economics from the University of Versailles (France) and a masters degree in sustainability science with a focus on ecological economics from Uppsala University (Sweden).
